Upon my Aunt Shirlee's death, I was at her house and started the arduous process of cleaning, sorting and tossing. There were times I would scream out "Aunt Shirlee, I love you but this is ridiculous". I wouldn't exactly call her a hoarder, but she definitely had things she loved to collect. Her collection of pie birds baffled me. As I'm sure some day my kids will be baffled as to why I hung on to some things.

What I found interesting was that when I got home, Pastor Cory preached on the gospel of Luke 12:13 – 21, The Parable of the Rich Fool. I use a New International Version Study Bible and found the notes in my Bible interesting and a little thought provoking.

- Life is more than material goods; far more important is our relationship with God. . . . When we bring problems to God in prayer, he often does the same—showing us how we need to change and grow in our attitude toward the problem. This answer is often not the one we were looking for, but it is more effective in helping us trace God's hand in our lives.
- Why do you save money? To retire? To buy more expensive cars or toys? To be secure? Jesus challenges us to think beyond earthbound goals and to use what we have been given for God's kingdom. Faith, service, and obedience are the way to become rich toward God.

This got me to thinking about how and what I spend my money on. I'll be honest with you, I've made some improvements and I have a lot more improvements to make.

As head of the finance committee, it also got me thinking about this time of the year when we start thinking about our next stewardship (financial) campaign. Doing this in a time of inflation, looking at retirement for some, school loans for some, and a change in any area of our lives makes us think about continuing to let our budget tell our story. 
